

FOLLOWERS ARE RECIPIENTS OF GOD'S GIFT

PRECEPT -

1 CORINTHIANS 12:7

⁷ A spiritual gift is given to each of us for the common good.

1 PETER 4:10-11

¹⁰ God has given each of you a gift from his great variety of spiritual gifts. Use them well to serve one another. ¹¹ Whoever speaks is to do so as one who speaks the oracles (the very words) of God. Whoever serves is to do so as one who serves by the strength which God supplies, so that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belongs the glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.

PROMISE ——

Following Jesus does not mean attending church every Sunday, repeating a prayer because the pastor says so, becoming a Christian because our parents or family says so, wearing some sort of Christian apparel or having Bible apps on our phones, celebrating Christmas just to be called a Christian, or to be wedded on a Christian setting. While these are good, they do not define one as a follower of Christ. A fan of Christ admires Him from a distance, while a follower adores, loves, and worships Him wholeheartedly. A fan of Christ is self-centred and fickle-minded, will leave Jesus when things go wrong, while a true follower is focused on Christ and will be faithful to Him until the end. An authentic follower of Jesus is someone who is transformed by Him, following Him closely, and on a mission with Him. One also receives gifts from God Himself through His Holy Spirit. Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 12:7, "A spiritual gift is given to each of us for the common good." This is a manifestation of God's sovereignty over a believer's life. Spiritual gifts are attributes given by the Holy Spirit to believers of Jesus which empowers them to serve the church for the glory of God. When we entrust and surrender our lives to Jesus, the Holy Spirit resides in us and gives us spiritual gifts that will enable and empower us to serve the body of Christ.
